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## MEMORANDUM

**SUBJECT:** SB 1 FY 2020 Funding

Attached is Resolution No. 4-15-2019-A that the City is required to adopt to receive the City's FY 2020 SB 1 funding allocation. This is a continuing process and the City's request will be submitted through an on-line portal. The City will be receiving \$77,747 in the current fiscal year. For FY 2020, this amount will be \$81,153

Given the storm damage the City experienced, and the limited streets and roads funds that are available, City staff recommends this next fiscal year's allocation be allocated for storm drain repair and the current year's allocation be reprogrammed for storm drain repairs.

As future funds become available, the City staff would propose that they be used for street overlay projects. Given the amounts available and the anticipated costs of the overlay projects, allocations may need to be carried over from year to year to have sufficient funds for a single project.





**RESOLUTION NO. 04-15-2019-A**

**RESOLUTION ADOPTING A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019-20 FUNDED BY  
SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017**

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the City must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

**WHEREAS**, the City, will receive an estimated \$81,153 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2019-20 from SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, this is the third year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, the City used a Project Priority List to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the community's priorities for transportation investment; and

**WHEREAS**, the funding from SB 1 will help the City maintain and rehabilitate active transportation infrastructure throughout the City this year and similar projects into the future; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City's streets and roads are in an "poor" condition and this revenue will help us increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into a "at-risk" condition; and



**WHEREAS**, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

**NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND** by the City Council of the City of Sonora, State of California, as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
2. The following list of proposed projects will be funded in-part or solely with fiscal year 2019-20 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:

Location – Sunrise Hills at Morningstar Drive  
Project - Storm Drain Outfall Line Emergency Repair and Replacement  
Useful Life - Thirty Years  
Year of construction - 2019

3. The following previously proposed and adopted projects may utilize fiscal year 2019-20 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues in their delivery. With the relisting of these projects in the adopted fiscal year resolution, the City is reaffirming to the public and the State our intent to fund these projects with Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:
