SUBJECT:

FISCAL YEAR 2016 TRAFFIC IMPACT MITIGATION FUND REPORT

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: City Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the City of Sonora's Traffic Impact Mitigation Fund Report as presented for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: California Government Code Title 7. Division 1. Chapter 5. Section 66006. requires that a local agency requiring the payment of a fee in connection with the approval of a development project make available to the public certain information for each fund or separate account established by the collection of such fees within 180 days after the last day of each fiscal year.

The information available to the public shall include:

- 1) A brief description of the type of fee in the account or fund.
- 2) The amount of the fee.
- 3) The beginning and ending balance of the account or fund.
- 4) The amount of fees collected and the interest earned.
- 5) An identification of each public improvement on which fees were expended and the amount of the expenditures on each improvement, including the total percentage of the cost of the public improvement that was funded with fees.
- 6) An identification of an approximate date by which the construction of the public improvement will commence if the local agency determines that sufficient funds have been collected to complete financing on an incomplete public improvement and the public improvement remains incomplete.
- 7) A description of each interfund transfer or loan made from the account or fund.
- 8) The amount of refunds made.

The local agency shall review the information made available to the public at the next regularly scheduled public meeting not less than 15 days after this information is made available to the public.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: The Fiscal Year 2016 Traffic Impact Mitigation Fund Report is set forth in Attachment A. Project information related to the Traffic Impact Mitigation Fund is listed in Attachment B. This report was made available to the public on December 5, 2016. A complete copy of the report is available for review at City Hall Administration located at 94 N. Washington Street Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 AM and 4:00 PM and on the City's website.

Traffic Impact Mitigation Fees are collected pursuant to Chapter 3.50 of the Sonora Municipal Code established in 1991 and City Council Resolution 11-16-98-A which adopted Traffic Impact Mitigation Fees based on an Updated Study of County Wide Circulation Improvement Needs. Traffic Impact Mitigation Fees for individual development projects are determined by the Community Development development project is determined from the Fee Schedule and multiplied by the escalated fee per trip at the time Director from Exhibit B (Fee Schedule) of Resolution 11-16-98-A. The number of new trips per day for the of the Building Permit application in accordance with Resolution 11-16-98-A.

For the Greenley Mono Intersection Project the City's share of the project costs were transferred from the Traffic Impact Mitigation Fund (Fund 350) to the Greenley Mono Intersection Project Fund (363) during FY 2015

There were no refunds made from the Traffic Impact Mitigation Fund during Fiscal Year 2016

Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Traffic Impact Mitigation Fund Report

This attachment addresses items 5) and 6) of the main report on the subject matter, and project expenditures listed on Attachment A

Item 5) An identification of each public improvement on which fees were expended, and the amount of the expenditures on each improvement, including the total percentage of the cost of the public improvement that was funded with fees.

1. Greenley-Mono Intersection Project, Phase 2

\$ 51,194.89

This expenditure from Traffic Mitigation Fees (fund 350) and the Greenley-Mono Intersection Project Fund (fund 363) reflects the commencement of Property Acquisition and Preliminary Engineering during FY 2015-16. During FY 2015-16, Environmental (Water Quality) Studies and Appraisals were completed, and Property Acquisition negotiations were commenced. Concept Plans were refined and Project Budget was completed. Final property acquisition and preparation of plans and specifications for bidding, with final construction is planned for FY 2016-17. This project is intended to be fully funded through Traffic Mitigation Fees of both the City of Sonora and the County of Tuolumne under a Cooperative Agreement.

2. Mono Way Widening Project

\$7,460.79

This expenditure from Traffic Mitigation Fees (Fund 350) and the Mono Way Widening Project Fund (fund 361) reflects follow up work on a project which was largely completed in FY 2014-2015. Costs incurred included surveying work in the replacement of property corners and exhibits for relinquishment of right of way between the City and the County, and administrative work in conducting a one year warranty inspection.

Under a Cooperative Agreement between City of Sonora and the County of Tuolumne, dated August 08, 2012, and amended April 07, 2014 after receipt of bids for the project, certain project costs from FY 2011-2012 forward are shared on a 9.6% City/90.4% County basis. Total budget for the project, as amended April 07, 2014, under the Cooperative Agreement was \$ 4,581,387.11.

Total project costs expensed to Traffic Mitigation Fees covered under the Cooperative Agreement for the Mono Way Widening Project from FY 2011-2012 to the end of FY 2014-2015 were \$4,374, 968.50 with a County share (90.4%) of \$3,954,971.52, and a City share (9.6%) of \$419,996.98.

Additional followup work in the areas for landscaping, tree replacement as required by state permits, and a corner monument at Fir Drive and Mono Way is intended to be conducted on the project in FY 2016-17.

6) An identification of an approximate date by which the construction of the public improvement will commence if the local agency determines that sufficient funds have been collected to complete financing on an incomplete public improvement, and the public improvement remains incomplete.

Projects listed under the County-wide Traffic Impact Mitigation Fee Program which are within the County are programmed by the County, and those projects which are within the City are programmed by the City, all based upon available funding. For those incomplete projects on the list of improvements which are within the City, the following projects are scheduled based upon available funding, environmental, and anticipated property acquisition:

- 1. Greenley/Mono Intersection Project, Phase 2: Property acquisition and preliminary engineering work on this project has commenced in FY 2015-16. Based on anticipated available funding, it is anticipated that full property acquisition and final design and construction would be completed in FY 2016-17. Portions of the property acquisition and project construction may be completed as developer frontage improvements in FY 2016-17
- 2. Mono Way Widening Project: Construction commenced on May 12, 2014 and was largely completed by the end of FY 2014-15. There are a few minor items remaining, as indicated above, which will be addressed in FY 2016-17.
- 3. Other signalization projects and projects listed in the Traffic Impact Mitigation Fee program will be scheduled as traffic warrants are met and funding is available..
